9 days Birdwatching and Wildlife Game drive -Rwanda-2019,

Trip Report

DAY 1: Tuesday, 3rd September 2019

Early morning on Tuesday, 3rd September, I have met my 2 client, Mr Michael and Andy, and we immediately head to Bugesera. The first stop was at Kamatana Valley and we were welcomed by **Lesser Jacana**, one of the rare species in Rwanda and most wanted species by client. Other species recorded

include African Fish Eagle, Redknobbed Coot, Long-tailed Cormorant, White-faced Whistling Duck, Yellowbilled Duck, Common Moorhen, African Jacana, etc. The second stop was at Mwogo wetland trying Papyrus Gonolek. We failed to see this spectacular species but we have seen Ruhuaha and Sooty Chat and Blackheaded Gonolek at Bugesera Lodge.



After lunch at Africa Bite, we proceeded to Akagera NP with a quick coffee stop at Imigongo Center and we have seen Common Fiscal. We reached the park at 4.40 and we were welcomed by a couple of Bohor Reedbuck and Bushbuck. Bird species seen at the entrance of the park include Bare-faced Go-away bird, Klaas's Cuckoo, Grey-backed Fiscal, Ring-necked Dove and Hamerkop. As park rules and regulation, the park activities start at 6am and close at 6pm. After registration at the park reception we head directly to the Akagera Game Lodge, where we stayed for 3 nights.

DAY 2: Wednesday 4th September 2019

On Wednesday, 4th September, we started birding in the garden of Akagera Game Lodge where were

lucky to see the spectacular species of the East Africa, the **Red-faced Barbet**. Other species sighted include Brubru, Laughing Dove, Green-capped Eremomela, African Grey Hornbill, Black-headed Weaver, Greater Blue-eared, Violet-backed and Ruppel's Long-tailed Starlings, Spot-flanked Barbet, Meyer's Parrot, African Black-headed Oriole, African Thrush, African Golden-breasted Bunting, etc. We continued our birding along Nyamwashama loop and we have seen Slate-colored Boubou, Zitting Cisticola, Tabora Cisticola, Trilling Cisticola, Temminck's Courser, Senegal Lapwing (Covering eggs), Crested Barbet, Crowned Lapwing, Grey-



headed Kingfisher, Green Woodhopoe, Greenw-nged Pytilia, etc.

We continued birding on hills side, at Muyumbu campsite, we sighted the rare Miombo Wren Warbler,

Bateleur, Black-chested Snake Eagle and Redheaded Weaver. We continued on the loop of the campsite and we sow Flapped Lark, Redcapped Lark, Northern Pufback and Cinnamon-breasted Rock Bunting. Additional to birds we have seen man ungulates grazing on the new shoots of the burnt grasses mainly Impalas, Defassa Waterback and Warthog.

After lunch we continued birding on lake circuit before heading to Lake Ihema for a sunset boat. On the circuit, we have seen Croaking Cisticola and Hildebrant's Francolin, White-chined Prinia, Red-chested Sunbird and



a big population of reintroduced Grey-crowned Crane.

DAY 3: Thursday 5th September 2019

On Thursday, 5th September, we had a day and evening night game drive. During the day, we sighted Ross's Turaco, Common Scimitabill, Chin-spot Batis, Sulphur-breasted Bushshrike, Red-faced Crombec. On night game drive we have seen Square-tailed Nightjar and herds of Buffaloes (about 200 individuals).

DAY 4: Friday 6th September 2019

On Friday, 6th September, we left Akagera NP to try different birds at Mashoza Relict Forest. The target was Gray-headed Bushshrike (*Malaconotus blanchoti*), unfortunately we failed this one and luckily we have seen **Lesser Honeyguide**, one of the wanted species by our clients. Other species spotted include

among other a flock of White-headed Saw-wing, Brown-throated Wattle-eye, Holub's Golden Weaver, Mackinnon's Fiscal, etc. We drove back to Kigali around 11am with a refreshment drink stop in Kayonza Center. After lunch at Africa Bite Restaurant, we drive to Nyabarongo-Ruliba ste and we have spotted Slender-billed Weaver. Mackinnon's Fiscal, Great Egret, Bronze Sunbird and among other.

Day 5: Saturday 7th September 2019

On Saturday, 7th September, the team left Kigali at



7am to Nyungwe National park with the target to see the maximum number of Endemics to the Albertine Rift Region out of 29 so far confirmed in this mountain Forest. Kigali to Nyungwe is a travel of 5 to 6 hours and we had a refresher stop at Huye before we head to Gisakura Guest House where we spent 4 nights. With well maintained trails, knowledgeable guide, Nyungwe NP is the best and easiest site to see birds endemic to the Albertine Rift in the region.

DAY 6: Sunday 8th September 2019

On Sunday, 8th September, we started at Uwinka interpretation center and we spent the whole morning in Umuyove trail and Rangiro road. We were lucky to see many endemics including Regal Sunbird,

Mountain-masked Apalis, Purple-breasted Sunbird, Strange Weaver, Rwenzori Other species seen include Great-blue Turaco. After lunch we went to Bweyeye road and we have seen Mountain Babbaler, Rwenzori Turaco, Blue-headed Sunbird and Olive Woodpecker. We stopped birding at 5pm, when we drove back to Gisakura Guest.

DAY 7: Monday 9th September 2019

Umuyove Trail was very productive with an easy walk and many endemic birds. On Monday, 9th September we came back the same trail in the morning and we have see Kungwe Apalis, Red-throated Owlet, Red-collared Mountain Babbler, White-headed Woodhopoe and Cabanis's Greenbul.



After a brief break at the Cantine at Uwinka reception, we had our afternoon at Gisakura and we have seen Willard's Sooty Boubou, White-tailed Crested-flycatcher, White-bellied Robinchat, Red-throated Alethe, Yellow-eyed Black Flycatcher.

DAY 8: Tuesday 10th September 2019

Tuesday, 10th September we went to Pindure trail and we saw Handsome Francolin, one of the endemics

to the Albertine Rift and we immediately drove back to Waterfall trail in Gisakura and we have seen Newman's Warbler, Blackfaced Rufous Warbler and another Red-collared Mountain Babbler, Red-throated Alethe, Tullberg's Woodpecker, Equatorial Akalat and we heard Yellow-bellied Wattle-eye. We had a break lunch at Gisakura Guest House and at 2pm we drove to Kamiranzovu wetland to see Grauer's Swamp Warbler and have also seen Stripe-breasted Tit, Mountain Illadopsis and Dusky Crimsonwing.

DAY 9: Wednesday 11th September 2019

Wednesday, 11th September, was the last day of this 9 days birding tour. The morning day was spent looking for the endemics we missed during the previous days. As the team had an evening flight, we had. We started at Gisakura and we saw Yellowbill, Dusky Tit and heard Narina Trogon. We continued at Uwinka and we saw briefly Dwarf Honeyguide. And finally we went at Bweyeye road and the last endemic seen was Albertine Boubou.



As a conclusion, the 9 days trip was very enjoyable and successful. The accommodation was basic but clean, the transport and guiding were well organized. The main target of this trip was to see maximum of Albertine Rift Endemics and we saw 25 out of 29 found in Nyungwe NP. We missed Kivu ground Thrush, Albertine Owlet, Shelley's Crimsowing, Rokefeller's Sunbird.
